COLUMBUS COMMONS DEBUTS THURSDAY, MAY 26 WITH LIVE + LOCAL MUSIC SHOWCASE FEATURING NEW HOLLOW, LOVESICK RADIO, NAKED KARATE GIRLS AND MORE: CAPITOL SOUTH ANNOUNCES FULL ENTERTAINMENT SCHEDULE FOR OPENING WEEKEND AND BEYOND

Capitol South gained control of City Center Mall in downtown Columbus in late 2007. Just over two years later and after extensive public feedback and collaboration, the nine acre site has now been transformed into a vibrant downtown park that will be activated throughout the year with varied programming to draw people from across central Ohio. Capitol South is in the final stages of preparation for the park's debut on May 26 starting at 4:00pm, which will feature a free "Live + Local" music showcase anchored by Ohio-based teen band and Billboard HOT 100 artists, New Hollow. New Hollow has selected the Columbus Commons opening concert as the venue to release nationally its new CD single, Airplanes.

Beginning at 4:00pm and concluding around 11:00pm, the Columbus Commons opening concert will also feature legendary Ohio bands playing everything from contemporary original music to rock, country, dance and retro cover music. These bands represent the dynamic musical talent that exists throughout the state and region's live music scene. More than just music, the bands deliver enthusiastic performances that include the audience and result in devoted fans. Ongoing, all performances and activities at Columbus Commons are free of charge and presented by Capitol South in collaboration with various community partners including CAPA, Columbus Metropolitan Library, Franklin Park Conservatory, Phoenix Theatre for Children, 2nd and 7 Foundation, Shadowbox Theatre and others. All musical and theatre performances will occur on the Columbus Commons stage located in the north quadrant of the park and other activities will be presented throughout the park.

Commons for Kids, Every Friday, 10:30am-12pm (June 3-September 2)

Friday mornings are all about kids at Columbus Commons. The free event will kick off with celebrity story time by OSU athletes and coaches, in partnership with the 2nd & 7 Foundation, and will be followed by a fun, interactive children's activity, with everything from jugglers and musicians, to inflatable and face painters. Kids can read, play,

Columbus Commons is located in downtown Columbus at 160 S. High Street and is bordered by High Street, Rich Street, Third Street and several buildings along State Street.

The Commons has parkside parking options with over 4,500 spaces located in adjacent garages and underneath the park itself. The park is staffed with private security 24 hours a day, seven days a week and welcomes patrons of all ages. Children 12 years of age and younger must be accompanied by an adult.

Capitol South led the effort to repurpose 1.2 million square feet of dead urban space and turn it into 9 live acres of inviting green space with trees, flowers, grass and walking paths. Now known as Columbus Commons, the former City Center Mall site debuts in May 2011 with an aggressive schedule of activities, events and performances designed to attract people of all walks of life downtown. Columbus Commons is within steps of the Ohio Statehouse and is expected to help support the development of walkable neighborhoods that integrate residential living with retail, office and entertainment space. Columbus Commons is located at 160 S. High Street and is bordered by High Street, Rich Street, Third Street and several buildings along State Street.
